

### 3. PREJUDICE and DISCRIMINATION - Lesson Plan (1 - 2 Lessons)

<b>Prior Learning:</b> - I know that people are all different and difference is a good thing. - I know about The Equality Act (2010) and how it helps to protect people from discrimination. - I can give some examples of what discrimination might look like in school or the wider world. - I know the difference between equality and equity. - I know that life can be easier or harder for some people depending on their identity.	
<b>Child Speak LO: Y5 and Y6</b> - I can say what discrimination and prejudice might look like in school or the wider world.

<b>SLIDES 2 - 6 - Recap</b> Use the lesson slides to recap The Equality Act (2010) and the difference between equality and equity	Whole Class
<b>(Prejudice relates to beliefs, thoughts and feelings about someone or a group of people. Prejudice is usually negative. Discrimination relates to actions against someone because of their identity or characteristics).</b>  <b>SLIDE 7 - 9 - Explain Prejudice and Discrimination</b> Use the lesson slides to explain the difference between prejudice and discrimination.  <b>Explain Hate Speech</b> Use the lesson slides to explain how hate speech is against the law in the UK.	Whole Class
<b>SLIDE 10 - Activity</b> Introduce the <a href="#">Scenarios</a> worksheet. Children to work in small groups on one or two scenarios each, discussing their possible answers to the questions. Focus on education and helping people understand the impact of their words/actions.  Groups could report back to each other and/or the whole class for discussion.	Small Groups, Whole Class
<b>Extension Activity - Unintentional Discrimination</b> Explain that sometimes discrimination (treating someone differently) occurs because we haven't thought things through and considered how different people need different things.  Use the resource <a href="#">Is your School Wheelchair Friendly?</a> to explore your school environment and activities and whether a child in a wheelchair would be able to participate fully in all activities.	Whole Class, Pairs/Small Groups
