


Key Points:

- We are all uniquely different.
- We are made up of things that stay the same and things that change.
- We should be proud of our individuality.
- We should respect that everyone is unique and special in their own right.

Most slides are self-explanatory. Activity slides are as follows:

Slide 2	• How many people are there on planet Earth? This question is designed to encourage the children to reflect on the very large number of people on the planet.	Individual answers or Paired Discussion
Slide 5	• How many people are the same? Children could show you their answer on their fingers.	Individual answers
Slide 10	• What parts of you will stay the same? E.g. Hair colour, eye colour, where you were born, etc. • What parts of you might change? E.g. Height, where you live, your favourite toy, etc.	Paired Discussion
Slide 11	• Core Values – What is most important to you? Ensure children understand what each one means.	Individual answers or Paired Discussion
Slide 14	• Can you find some things that are the same about you and others and some things that are different? Encourage children to reflect on more than just their physical features.	Paired Discussion
Slide 16	• What does [respect] look like in your school? E.g. Taking turns, holding doors, listening to each other, etc. • How do we show respect to each other – adults and children? Encourage adults to talk about how they show their respect to children too.	Paired Discussion
Slide 17	• Take a moment to think about what makes you special. You might want to play some music here to allow children time to think. Adults could also share a few of their thoughts too.	Individual Reflection

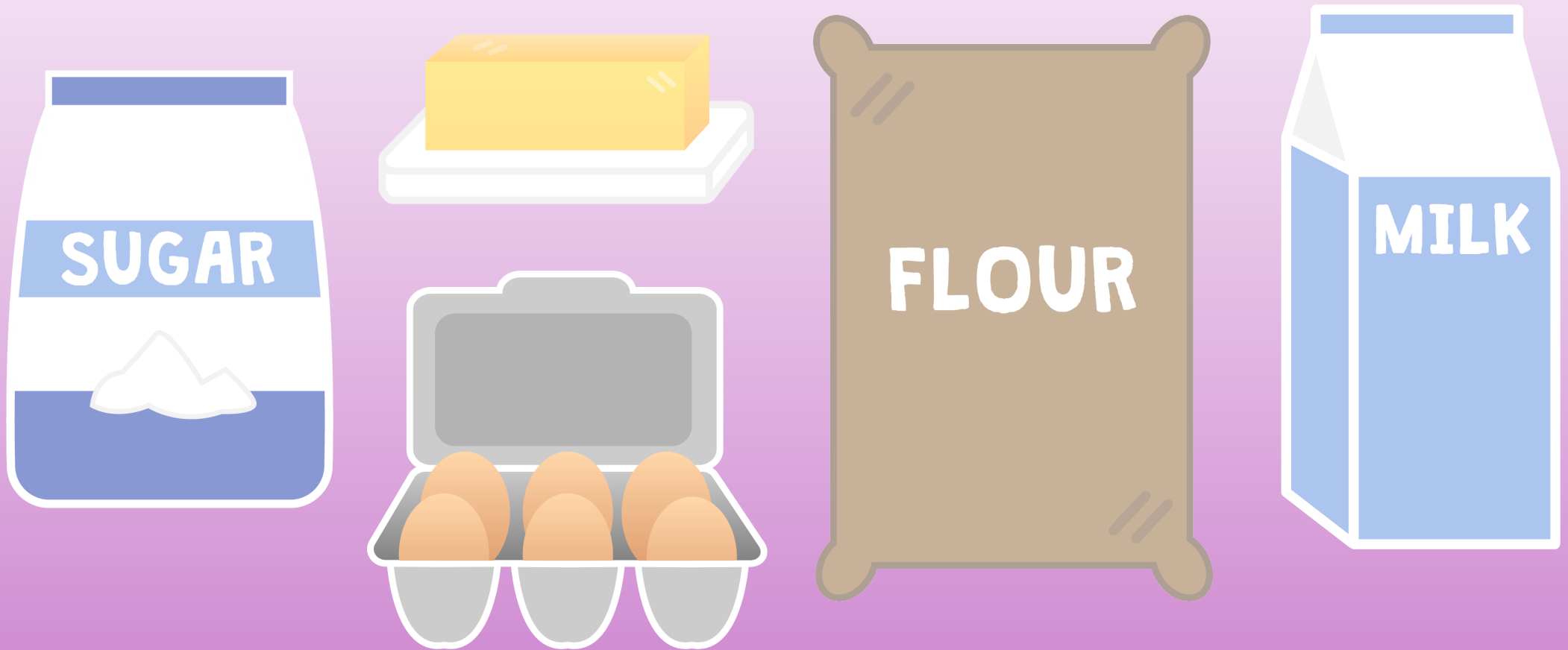

The ingredients by themselves do not make the cake...

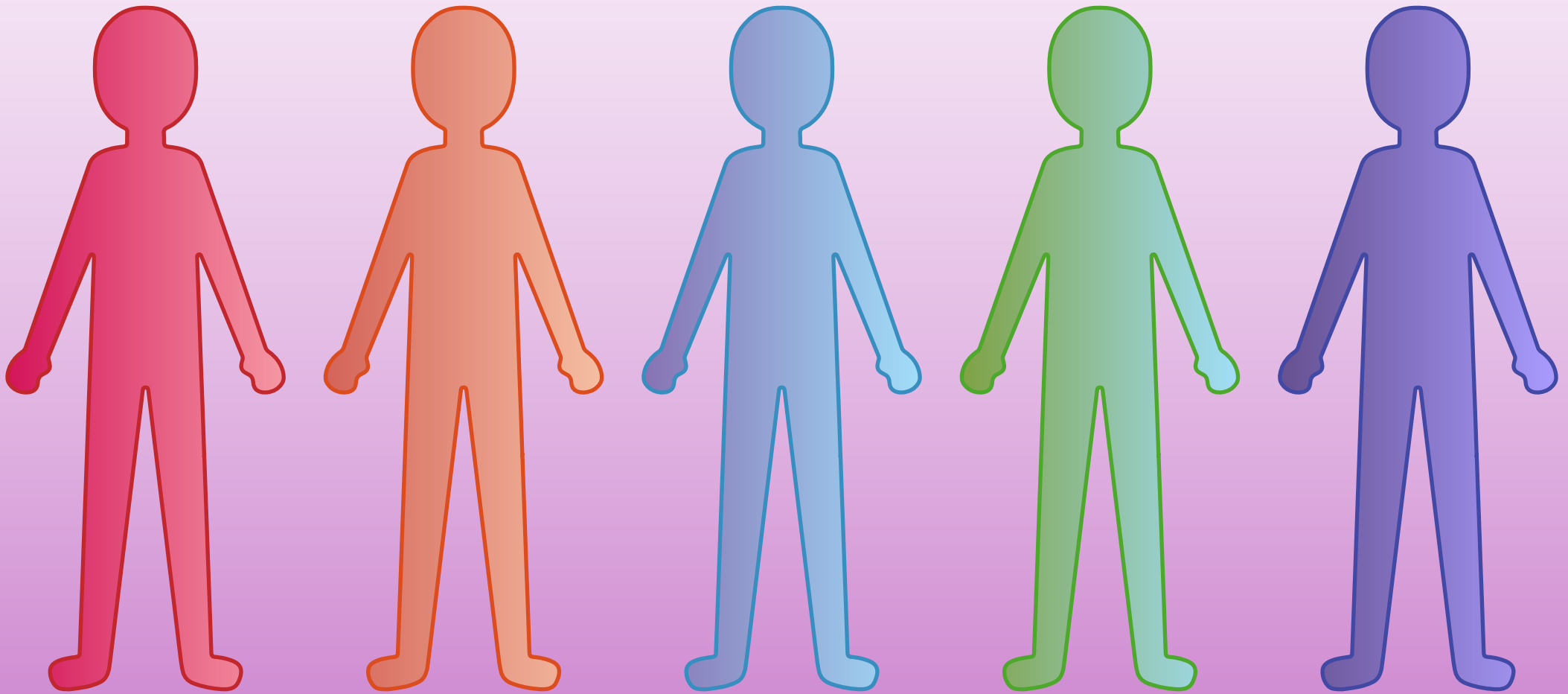


...but put them together and you have a masterpiece.

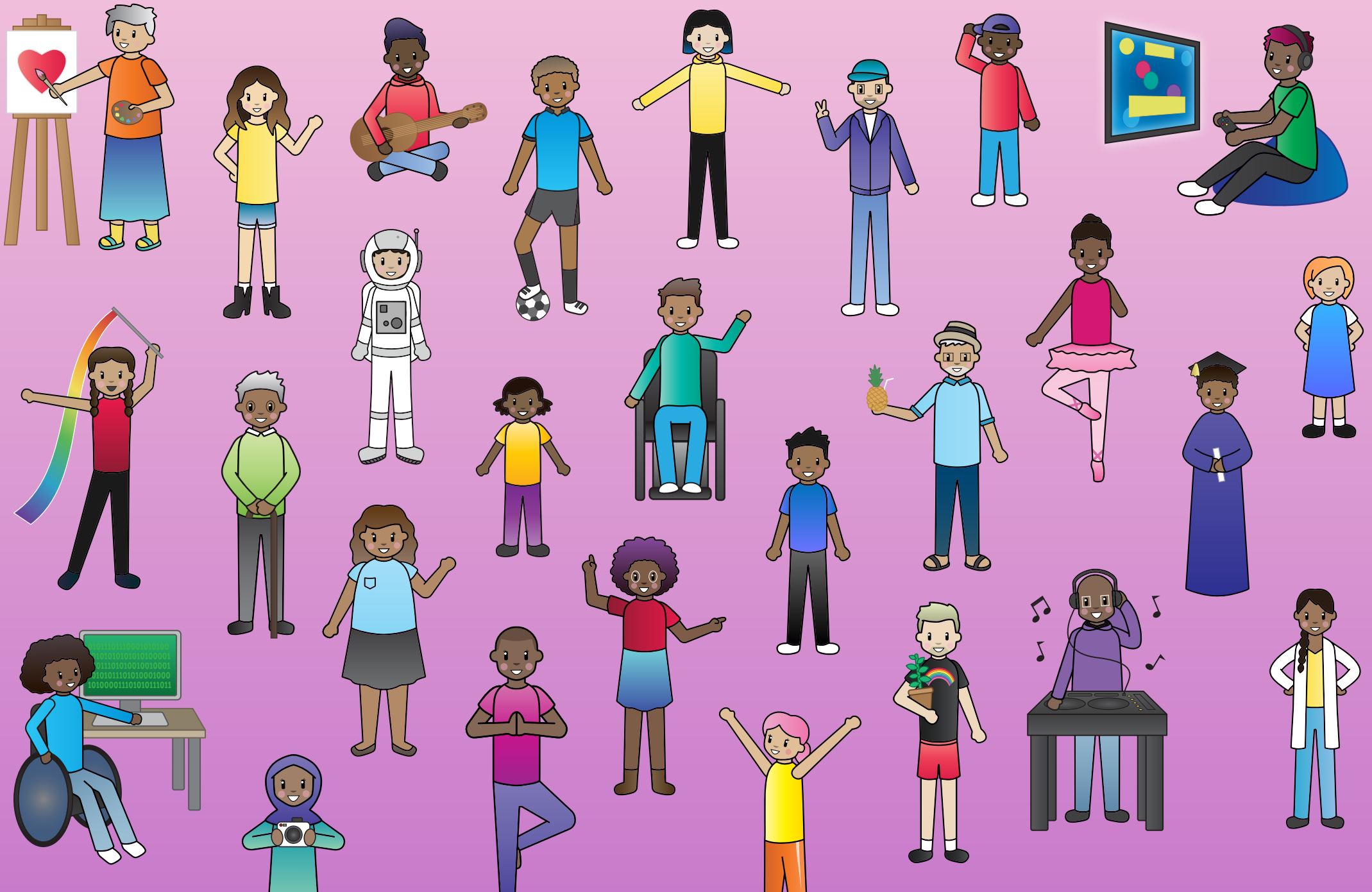


Just like a cake, our identity is made up of lots of different parts.
